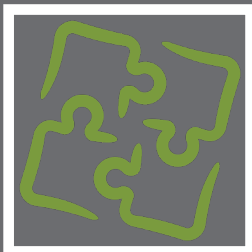

Presentation Title: 2025 & Beyond: Historic Realignment and its Global Impact

Kellyanne Conway played a key role in advising the historic Republican campaign to reclaim the White House in 2016, becoming the first woman to lead a winning presidential campaign, leveraging her deep expertise in political strategy and data analytics. Today, she advises world leaders, as well as public and private organizations, on strategy, execution, and public sentiment.

As a keynote speaker, Kellyanne Conway draws on her three decades of experience as a pollster and data analyst to offer an insider's view of the 2024 election results, breaking down this transformative political realignment and examining voting trends by demographics, regions, and key battleground areas. She will explore what these shifts mean for both major political parties in the years ahead. Additionally, Kellyanne will provide insights into the priorities and strategies of the winning party covering expected policies, personnel decisions, and legislative goals.

ABOUT KELLYANNE:

Kellyanne Conway served as Campaign Manager of the come-from-behind victory of Trump-Pence 2016, making her the first woman in U.S. history to successfully helm a presidential campaign. For nearly four years, Kellyanne served as Assistant to the President and Senior Counselor to the President at the White House, working on a range of issues affecting domestic and global policy.

She was Founder and President of The Polling Company, Inc. / WomanTrend a privately-held, woman-owned corporation she operated from 1995-2017. Kellyanne is one of the most quoted and noted pollsters on the national scene, having provided commentary on thousands of television shows on ABC, CBS, NBC, PBS, CNN, CNBC, MSNBC, HBO, Comedy Central, MTV, Fox News, on the paid speaking circuit and for numerous radio shows and print stories. Currently, she is a Fox News Contributor, featured multiple times per week and for special coverage of debates, caucuses, primaries, conventions, general elections and other major events.

Throughout her 35 years in market research, Kellyanne has provided primary research and advice for clients in all 50 states and has directed thousands of demographic and attitudinal survey projects for statewide and congressional political races, trade associations, and Fortune 500 companies. Kellyanne is a “fully-recovered” attorney, licensed to practice law in four jurisdictions (Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and the District of Columbia). She holds a law degree, with honors, from George Washington University Law Center and completed her undergraduate studies at Trinity College and Oxford University.

Kellyanne has served on numerous boards and advisory councils. Her latest business, KAConsulting LLC, provides strategic advice, data analytics, and media training to corporate, political and nonprofit clients. They furnish thought leadership to numerous corporations, particularly companies and industry under threat of government action or companies and industry simply peaking around the corner and preparing for the implications of the next year.

Nate Silver’s FiveThirtyEight recognized her firm as one of the top pollsters in the nation, with 91% accuracy in predicting races during the 2022 midterm cycle whereas polling overall was overly optimistic and fraught with error. Most recently, she was pollster for the newly elected Governor of Louisiana, winning in a jungle primary outright and overwhelmingly.

Kellyanne is mom to four amazing teenagers. Her memoir, Here’s The Deal, published in May of 2022, was a #1 New York Times bestseller.

OPERATIONS TRACK PRESENTATIONS - (Monday - 1:30-3:15 PM)

Presentation Descriptions

Each presentation will be 15 minutes long with 5-minute transitions between each.

1:30 - 1:50 PM

Presentation Topic: Nano-Clay Rheology Modifier - Acti-Gel

Presenter: Paul Fendley, Active Minerals International LLC

Problem: A concrete producer in Central Pennsylvania was required to use a mix design with 100% manufactured sand for the construction of warehouses. While the design appeared pumpable on paper, field conditions told a different story—the mix would not pump. With deadlines looming and traditional viscosity-modifying admixtures (VMAs) proving ineffective, the producer found themselves seemingly out of options.

Solution: The nano-clay rheology modifier known as Acti-Gel was introduced as a solution to the problem. Once added in the truck, the concrete exhibited a thixotropic behavior and enhanced cement paste. The result was concrete easily pumped, placed and finished.

1:50 - 2:10 PM

Presentation Topic: Command Alkon's Material Supply & Ticketing Accounting

Presenters: Michael Hoagland & David Skarzynski, Command Alkon

Problem: Paper tickets piling up on desks, batch operators spent over an hour a day entering data, errors from manual data entry slipping through to accounting, fixing these mistakes resulted in more time lost. They needed less data entry and more accuracy.

Solution: Command Alkon's Material Supply & Ticketing Accounting eliminated manual entry and streamlined inventory updates. The solution reduced the company's ticket entry time from over an hour to just 15 minutes per day, with operators now uploading tickets throughout the day instead of letting them pile up.

2:10 - 2:30 PM

Presentation Topic: Alliance Low Water Washer 410

Presenters: Dan Whitmyer & Jon Bennington, Kemper

Problem: The customer was operating a standard cone/jaw recirculating plant in a limestone quarry, producing 40-60 TPH of -1/4" dry screenings. In their unwashed state, these screenings had no value. To process them, the customer transported the screenings several miles away to a wash

plant with a standard screen and screw, adding additional costs per ton in handling and transport costs.

Solution: Kemper implemented an Alliance Low Water Washer 410 extended unit, which accepted feed directly from the crushing circuit. By processing material on site, the customer eliminated transport costs, improved efficiency, and produced a consistent asphalt sand product that met specifications.

2:30 - 2:50 PM

Presentation Topic: PennClean HT

Presenter: Len McIntosh, Oil Service, Inc.

Problem: Poor thermal balance & asphalt plant resulting in difficult & costly start-ups. Increased fuel burn at start-up & to maintain production temperature. Quality of heat transfer fluid deteriorating, carbon buildup around piping & valves lowering efficiency & operation.

Solution: PennCool HT added to system effectively eliminating all buildup, dissolved acids, revitalized heat transfer fluid, avoiding a full drain/flush & re-charge. Significant cost savings yielded, binder tank and silo able to be brought back online increasing efficiency and profitability. Provided general operational efficiency and improvements.

2:50 - 3:10 PM

Presentation Topic: Slabstack Technology

Presenter: Eliot Grossman, Slabstack

Problem: The customer's sales system was caught up in spreadsheets and an ineffective MobileSales setup. Quotes took too long, pricing was inconsistent, and no one had a clear picture of backlog or margins. Rapid growth and an outdated quoting tool created four big pain points: 1. Inefficient Manual Processes 2. Lack of Effective Margin Control 3. Limited Reporting and Analytics & 4. No Two-Way Integration with Dispatch

Solution: The customer replaced ad-hoc quoting with a centralized, data-driven workflow using Slabstack. With embedded margin controls and live pricing data, they now quote with 98–100% confidence and have seen a 30% increase in margins. Real-time integration with dispatch platforms and actionable analytics provide visibility across pipeline, pricing, and production, enabling smarter, faster decisions.
